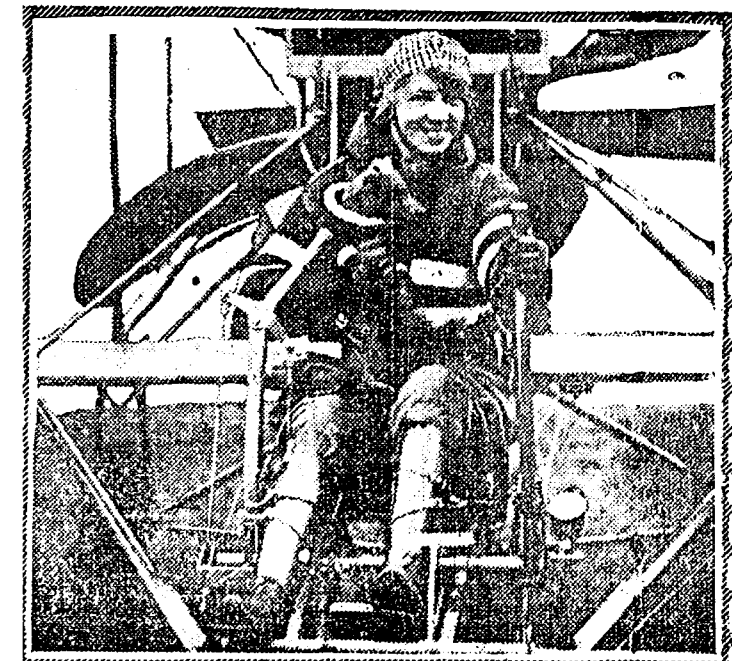
HAPPY "WUNST" A YEAR. ANYWAY!
