Carol is the lead trainer for the Library of Congress Teaching with Primary Sources

program at Governors State University. During winter 2005, she learned about primary sources in the Library of Congress' Adventures of the American Mind. During this class, she created a lesson on Our Community, Past, Present and Future with a focus on Harvey, Illinois in which she incorporated Library of Congress primary sources. In addition, she added professional development activities that could be used to teach about primary sources and visual literacy. In the fall of 2006, she completed training in Digital Storytelling using Primary Sources.

When Carol served as an Adjunct Professor at Governors State University, she taught courses integrating technology into the reading/writing curriculum and into the math curriculum. She has worked in Harvey School District 152 for the last 26 years as a first grade teacher, a literacy coach, a technology facilitator, Reading First Coordinator, and Reading Coordinator. Before that, she taught fifth and sixth grades for five years in Roseville, Ohio.

Carol has a master's degree in Education from Governors State with an emphasis in mathematics education, has certification as a reading teacher, and has completed all of the requirements except the dissertation for a doctorate in Educational Leadership from Roosevelt University.
