Mary is a TPS Facilitator for the Library of Congress Teaching with Primary Sources program at Governors State University. During spring 2006, she joined other Governors State faculty in the Library of Congress' Adventures of the American Mind in which she designed a lesson on copyright. In the summer of 2010, she participated in Teaching with Primary Sources and created a lesson on the Evolution of the Training Manual in which she incorporated LOC primary sources from the 1700s, 1800s, and 1900s.

Mary, an Associate Professor at Governors State University, has been teaching graduate classes in instructional design, performance improvement, and communications for over 15 years. She has won three Faculty Excellence awards from Governors State University and four Awards of Excellence from the International Society for Performance Improvement for her two instructional CDs, book, and training evaluation research.
